NOT ALLOWED: Railroad ties, green- treated lumber, boards with nails, and any construction materials.



Now that the school year has officially begun, the Frazee Police Department would like to remind everyone of a few items. First, please take your time to slow down and pay attention to those walking to school. Additionally watch for slowing school buses and the bus stop sign arm. State law requires all vehicles to stop for school buses when the bus driver activates the flashing lights and has the crossing arm fully extended. Lastly, drop your child off in designated drop off zones. Dropping your child off while on Highway 87 is not safe.

EAST MAIN BRIDGE CLOSURE

On the morning of August 30, the East Main bridge was closed for rehabilitation of the bridge deck on Main Ave E over the Otter Tail River. The bridge is closed for thru traffic from South River Drive to Lake St North and completely closed from South River Drive to 4th St SE for the duration of the project.

The bridge will remain closed for about 3.5 weeks until approximately **Friday, September 22.**
