WINTER PARKING

Message from Chief: Please be courteous and work with the city snow plow crew. If you notice the plow has cleared one side of the street, kindly move your vehicle to the cleared side to help ensure the snow is removed efficiently. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated and helps keep the streets safe and clear for everyone. Thank you, Chief Tyler.

Snow Emergency Declaration: If hazardous road conditions occur due to snow, ice, or other weather events, the Public Works Superintendent (or Chief of Police) can declare a snow emergency for up to 72 hours. This emergency may end earlier if conditions improve.

Notice of Emergency: A snow emergency will be announced via radio, television, or press, with at least two (2) hours notice before it begins.

Parking Restrictions: During a snow emergency, parking is prohibited on streets from 1:00 A.M. to 7:00 A.M.

Resumption of Parking: Parking can resume once snow removal or street cleaning is completed, except where other restrictions apply. Where parking is normally permitted on only one side of the street, vehicles parked pursuant to the aforesaid provision may be parked on that side of the street only.

GENERAL PARKING

Alley Parking: Vehicles, excepts those used by the city for fire, police, or emergency medical services, may not park in alleys for more than three (3) minutes, unless actively loading or unloading.

Sales & Storage of Vehicles: Vehicles cannot be parked on streets or city parking lots for sale or display purposes.

Maximum Parking Time: Vehicles may not park on street or city parking lots for more than 24 hours.
