City Ordinance Reminder: Keep Streets and Sidewalks Clear

The City of Frazee reminds residents of the following ordinances designed to keep our community safe and clean:

No Deposits on Streets (7-1-1)

It is unlawful to throw or deposit dirt, rubbish, yard waste, or other debris onto city streets, sidewalks, alleys, or public grounds. This includes grass clippings, snow, and similar materials.

Snow, Ice, and Debris on Sidewalks (7-1-2)

Property owners and occupants are responsible for keeping sidewalks adjacent to their property safe for pedestrians. Snow, ice, dirt, or rubbish must be removed **within 24 hours** after it is deposited. If not removed, the City may clear the sidewalk and assess the cost to the property owner.

Sidewalk Repairs (7-1-3)

Owners are also responsible for maintaining and repairing sidewalks next to their property. If a sidewalk is deemed unsafe, the City will issue notice for repairs. If not addressed within the given timeline, the City will complete the work and bill the property owner, with costs added as a special assessment.

By working together, we can keep Frazee's sidewalks and streets safe, clean, and welcoming for everyone.

Active Transportation Trail Project

Construction has begun on the Wannigan Regional Park Active Transportation Trail Project, creating two miles of paved shared-use trail. This new trail will provide safe and accessible walking, biking, and recreational opportunities while enhancing connectivity within the park. During construction, please call City Hall for park closure updates.
