- 1. General Updates
 - a. **Rezoning Request** A resident has requested to rezone their property. Due to public hearing requirements, this request will be reviewed by the Planning & Zoning Committee at their March 26, 2024 meeting with a recommendation being given to the Council at the March 27, 2024 meeting.

- b. Clerk's Conference I will be our of the office attending the annual MCFOA Clerk's Conference March 19-22. Class topics include discussions on human resources and ESST, financial fraud and cybersecurity scams, adult use cannabis, and advanced budgeting.
- c. **Becker County Hazard Mitigation Plan** I participated in the first meeting to update this plan. It was last updated in 2016. I will be talking with Department Heads to complete their assessments.
- d. Wellhead Protection Plan Larry and I have been meeting with representatives from MRWA over the winter to update the wellhead protection plan. We are at the point that a public hearing will be held. This will be coming in the next couple months after all notifications have been made and timelines have been followed.
- e. Salary Classification & Compensation Study The RFP is set to be posted on March 4.
- f. **Liquor License Fee Increase Public Hearing** The notices were mailed on February 22, 2024. The public hearing can not take place for 30 days after the notification was sent; as such, the public hearing will be set for the March 27, 2024 meeting.
- g. **City/Dram Shop Insurance** For the City property/liability insurance, I received the estimates and they came in \$4,690 higher than last year the departments with the highest increase are water (\$915), fire (\$766) and admin (\$725). Two departments had decreases in rates police (276) and cemetery (\$4).
- h. **Maple Ave Property** Tina has added this property to our website.
- i. **Garbage Contract** The contract has been received back. We are done with this until 2026.
- j. **OK Lumber Parcel** Waiting for this to be recorded at the County. Given to City Attorney on 11/13/23. I emailed for an update.
- k. All-n-All Pump Area Property Parcel located in All-n-All's gas station pump area remains listed as owned by City of Frazee. City staff notified Becker County on 10/30/2023. Tina has not heard back from the County yet.
- Sanders Parcel Still listed as owned by Roger Sanders when it should be listed owned by the EDA. City staff notified Becker County on this earlier this year and is continuing to work towards getting this fixed.

2. Financials

a. December books have not been completed as time has been spent on getting the utility billing system up and running. The utility system is up and running, but I have not had a chance to complete the December financials. I'm planning to work on this next week.

3. Projects

- a. **Event Center/Liquor Store Roof** The heating unit bids have been signed and sent to Tweeton. Larry will begin working on shingling quotes in March.
- b. **Town Lake Beach** –The DNR was sent the required items for the amendment and extension and we received a response with additional questions. Those questions have been responded to and we are hopeful for an answer by the end of February.
- c. Wannigan Regional Park A public meeting was held on Thursday for Wannigan and the Frazee Community Club. There was a presentation made to the board regarding the TAP grant. The ATI grant was submitted. I am working with FCDC, Widseth, and CCC on the applications for the DNR Outdoor and GMRPTC grants. LREC needs to talk to the electrician for getting electricity to the park, FCDC has an RFP out for an electrician.
- d. **Eagle Lake Park** Waiting on the court.
- e. **East Main Project** Bidding will be taking place this spring.
- f. Heartland Trail No new news

5. State Bonding Request

Our initial request to be included in the Governor's bonding bill was not moved forward. However, Representative Knudsen and Senator Utke have drafted bills to fund our request. 6. Banyon Goals

All programs are up and running! January 1 bills went out on February 8, and February 1 bills are being processed as I type. We are back on schedule with utility billing beginning with the March 1 bill. During the change over, late fees and disconnections have not been assessed or done, we will begin assessing late fees and sending disconnection notices again in April. Thank you for all your support in this change over. It has taken a lot of extra work, but in the end it will be worth it! We can officially say that the Banyon change over goal has been accomplished and remove it from our list of goals.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS AND ORDERING ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS

WHEREAS, pursuant to a resolution passed by the Council on February 14, 2024, the city's designated engineer has prepared plans and specifications for the construction of C.S.A.H. 30 (East Main Avenue, between the Otter Tail River bridge crossing and northeast to the south line of Trunk Highway 87 with watermain, sanitary sewer, storm sewer, street and sidewalk improvements; and to improve Rivercrest Drive between East Main Avenue and northerly 400 feet to the end of pavement on Rivercrest Drive with street improvements; and to improve 8th Street SE between East Main Avenue and easterly to the intersection with Cherry Avenue with street improvements; and to improve Cherry Avenue with street improvements; and to improve the alley way one block north of Main Avenue West between 2nd Street NW and 3nd Street NW, and has presented such plans and specifications to the council for approval;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF FRAZEE, MINNESOTA:

- Such plans and specifications, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, are hereby approved.
- The City authorizes the Becker County Highway Department to proceed with the public bidding process. The advertisement shall be published for a minimum of fourteen days, shall specify the work to be done, shall state that bids will be received by the State at a to be determined time, date and location, at which time they will be publicly opened by the Becker County Highway Department.

- 1) FCDC urgently supports and applauds the city moving the Town Beach project toward 2024 construction. We need to show substantial progress on Town Beach, because it affects the Wannigan plans for an Outdoor Recreation application to fund Natural Surface Trails, Overlooks, Restroom, 2 Small Shelters, 4 Primitive Campsites totaling approximately \$750,000 in funding.
- 2) North Country Trail Easement is with the City Attorney for final review. The draft easement was in a council packet in August and is the same except exhibits "B" and "C" have been added. "B" is the Description of Easement Area and "C" is the map of the easement. Our goal is to have it in an upcoming consent agenda.
